
### Club Night Wednesday 2nd March

A Fair question, given the costs involved, the hundreds of hours of planning, arranging site visits to possible accommodation & show venues, endless committee meetings, getting people involved in giving their time & expertise in everything from filling

goodie bags to organising the showing of the cars! Then of course the people who travel with their mustangs from all corners of the country & clean their prized possessions for showing, only to drive them home again and more than likely clean them thoroughly again.

So, why bother?

Since the first all Mustang convention held in Taranaki over Labour weekend in 1979 (the 1978 show was a Cadillac & Mustang show) there has been some 36 National Mustang Conventions, the 2016 year is the 37<sup>th</sup> National Convention. So there is a rich history of the 5 Mustang clubs hosting the conventions until 2011 when the Southern Mustang Owners Club hosted a very successful convention with 250 + members present, despite their smaller club membership number.

It is worth noting that already there are over 100 rooms booked at the Spencer On Byron for the 2016 Convention, some 7 months before the Labour weekend event. Furthermore, the 2010 Convention held here in Auckland was run at a surplus and those funds were to be held to fund future conventions. The current committee are committed to ensure that this convention pays its way and does not impact on club funds. Having been privileged to attend six conventions, here's some reasons why I look forward to labour weekends at a convention.

Firstly, I love Mustangs, the early classics have a unique appeal, bearing in mind these are the cars that launched the single most successful automotive release & sales volume in the history of cars. Yes, a huge vote of respect & honour must surely follow these icons. The 67 & 68 models while being closely reminiscent of the early cars, these cars put the "Muscle" into the Mustang with a new range of big & powerful engines along with the exposure of such cars as the "Bullitt" and a host of other publicity exposures, again stamping their own unique place in car history. The 69 & 70 Mustangs are my own personal favourites and it is these wonderful cars that spawned the famous Boss amongst other momentous models such as the H Code & closure of the Shelby cars for some 38 years! Then followed the "big Mustangs" of 71 – 73, these cars, bringing closure on 9 momentous years of this easily recognisable marque

Take a look at the "Conventions" segment on the NZMustang.com website and look at the convention photos of the early years. You will see very proud owners of the cars from that era and these are the good folk who enthusiastically went about forming the early clubs and of course making the 1<sup>st</sup> and many following conventions a reality. In my humble opinion, a vote of gratitude is indeed due to these dedicated Mustang owners who kicked this wonderful tradition off.!

The strong desire we have to chat & compare notes with people who have similar models to our own Mustang is probably a strong case for something more formal than a local get together & run, surely a convention in the making!

Secondly, while the cars are indeed the common denominator in the desire to hold a convention it is fair to say that the people who make up the New Zealand Mustang owners clubs and who make the work involved in putting a convention together, the time & effort in everything from planning the venue to the final farewell breakfast, a successful rewarding experience. It is these folk from all walks of life who have a story or three about why they chose a Mustang, how they came upon their car, its history, the issues they have encountered, the trips away, possibly done Route 66 or being at a new model launch, going to the Shelby factory, not to mention the fun they have had getting to know other Mustang owners. These interesting people create a rich tapestry of experience who are only too willing to drive from one end of the country to the other, only to clean their car to an exacting standard and have it judged with other like cars. A chance to look at a collection of Mustangs from all over New Zealand and enjoy a lot of fun at the Friday evening get together & traditional Sunday run, the Sunday evening dress-up & prize-giving is always a huge fun event, not to mention the inevitable dance that follows!

So if you enjoy meeting interesting Mustang folk from across the country who invariably leave a convention having formed more new friendships that will last a lifetime, then we are so much the better for attending yet another convention, money well spent I would suggest!

Conversely, there are a lot of Mustang owners throughout this great little country who chose not to belong to a club and that is their choice, but for me and a whole bunch of others, there are few things that rival the challenge and fun of a well-run national Mustang convention.

### The Art of Travelling in Convoy

The musings of an old bloke who has been trying to travel in a convoy of MUSTANGS for more years than he would like to record.

We all like to travel with a Mustang in front and a Mustang in the rear view mirror. Makes for a very enjoyable experience. It used to also assist with braking – you knew the car in front and the one behind had bad brakes as well – so nose-to-tails were less likely. But now we have all these "lazy" folk who like to drive flash new Mustangs with proper suspension, tyres and brakes (ABS). Even though many have a "proper" Mustang at home....... (lets not stir that up – each to their own).

Back to the guts of the article.

The object of a convoy is to try and stay together and the following may help.

In the city at traffic lights there are often 2 lanes for a short distance through the lights. The purpose is to get as many vehicles through on each phase. So in this case USE BOTH LANES and when we merge on the other side we are back in convoy. All politely staying in the left lane means we merge with a pile of Jappas on the other side and "hello" where has our convoy gone, and only half the group got through. Watch the Mustang in your rear mirror and slow down if they drop back. The car in front of you will do the same and we will stay together. Easier than trying to chase the car in front. However if the car behind is shagging around – forget them and chase the car in front. Seriously, do try and keep up or else the cars at the back seem to be hardly moving. Someone intelligent may be able to explain the physics of why the back car always goes much slower than the front one. Stop to regroup and have a chat occasionally. Good social stuff, chance for some photos, and the public love to see a bunch of Muzzies assembled together.

When we take off again, keep an eye on your wing mirror and it is best if the last car pulls out first (sort of blocking the traffic) and everyone else pulls out together. Also the last car has the best view of when a gap is coming. Guess what – we are still in convoy formation.

If you are pulling over for a comfort stop, a snog or some other personal reason, make sure you, or preferably someone on the right side of the car, gives the thumbs up so the following cars don't stop to help — especially when you are intending to do something private with which you do not need help.

No doubt there are lots of other useful suggestions out there so lets have them.
